

War of 1812 Society – Application of David K. Faux a Descendant of Captain Daniel Young of the 5<sup>th</sup> Lincoln Militia and Private Abraham Young of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Lincoln Militia, Who Served 1812 to 1814

Evidence that:

- A. Captain Daniel Young of the 5<sup>th</sup> Lincoln Militia, saw action during the War of 1812.

Evidence (numbers below correspond to numbers on photocopies):

- 1) Testimony of Jacob Hagel of North Glanford (Wentworth County) in 1875, that he enrolled in Barton Township, and served as a private under Captain Daniel Young, and was present at the Battles of Fort Erie and Blackrock.
- 2) Paylists stating that Capt. Daniel Young 5<sup>th</sup> Regt L M was at Beaver Dams and the Board authorized payment for Young and his company for dates in November 1813 and August 1814.
- 3) Return of 5<sup>th</sup> Lincoln Militia Rations at Niagara 23d Oct 1812.
- 4) Muster Rolls from 1812 to 1814 of Captain Daniel Young's Company (not included). These are for informational value only since I hand copied them from microfilms of the originals. The above documents better meet the stated criteria.
- 5) Muster roll of Captain Charles Askins of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Lincoln Militia [of Haldimand District on the Grand River] which names Abraham Young as a private serving with said regiment.
- 6) Muster roll of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Lincoln Militia of those who served at the Battle of Chippewa, including Private Abraham Young.

- B. David K. Faux is a descendant of Captain Daniel Young of the 5<sup>th</sup> Lincoln Militia.

Evidence (numbers below correspond to the numbers on the photocopies):

- 1) Birth certificate for David K. Faux, son of Kenneth Claud Faux and Violet Mae Williamson.
- 2) Baptismal certificate from Christs Church Cathedral, Anglican, Hamilton, Ontario for Violet Mae Williamson, daughter of Gilbert Williamson and Eva Fern Dawson.
- 3) Marriage certificate for Kenneth Claud Faux and Violet Mae Williamson, daughter of Gilbert Williamson and Eva Fern Dawson.
- 4) Birth certificate for Eva Fern Dawson, born Hamilton, Ontario, daughter of Joe Dawson and Annie McCormac.
- 5) Marriage certificate for Gilbert Williamson and Eva Fern Dawson, Christ's Church Cathedral, Anglican, Hamilton, Ontario.

- 6) Death certificate of Joseph William Dawson, car – train collision, Halton County, Ontario, son of John Dawson, born Ontario and Adelia Young, born Ontario (his birth not registered).
- 7) Marriage certificate of Joseph Dawson and Annie McCormack, Hamilton, Ontario. Joseph the son of John and Dilly Dawson. The name “Dilly” is a nickname, a short form of the second name of Hannah Adelia Young, as will be attested in the documents below.
- 8) 1891 Census of Hamilton, Ontario including John Dawson and wife Hannah Dawson, with children Joseph Dawson, Arthur Dawson, Ada Dawson, and Ida Dawson.
- 9) 1896 marriage certificate for Robert John Crowe and Ada Artemus Dawson (see above), the daughter of John Dawson and Hannah Adelia Young. The applicant knew his Great Great Aunt Ada, and she attested that her mother’s full name was Hannah Adelia Young, and that the latter’s father’s name was Henry Young. I have this interview on audio tape from the late 1970s.
- 10) Information as to the marriage of John Dawson and Hannah Adelia Young from the Hamilton Spectator, on “Elopement in Barton” where the 15 year old daughter of Henry Young [Hannah Adelia Young] eloped with [John] Dawson with the assistance of the latter’s father George Dawson. The father of the bride (who took George Dawson to Court) is named as Henry Young of Ryckman’s Corners in Barton Township (today, Hamilton, Ontario).
- 11) Second marriage of Hannah Dawson, daughter of Henry Youngs and Elizabeth Youngs to John Day. The spelling of Young is incorrect but correct in the death certificate of Hannah Day.
- 12) Death certificate of Hannah Day, daughter of Henry Young, born in Ontario and Elizabeth Young, born in Ontario [the latter two were first cousins].
- 13) First marriage of Henry Young and Elizabeth Young noted in the latter’s obituary taken from the book of obituary notices kept by Hannah Adelia (Young) Dawson / Day and her daughter Ada Artemus (Dawson) Crowe. The notation is in the handwriting of my Great Great Aunt Ada.
- 14) Second marriage for Henry Young, born Barton Township, Ontario (today Hamilton), son of Henry Young and Rachel Young. The latter two were first cousins once removed.
- 15) Photographs of tombstones for individuals noted under 2 to 13 above.
- 16) The second wife of Henry Young administered his estate and named all his children including “Hannah Adelaide Dawson”. Isabella, the step-mother of Hannah, did not quite get her step daughter’s name correct.
- 17) Land petition of Henry Young [Senior] of the Township of Barton, the son of Daniel Yonge (spelling sworn by Richard Beasley as Daniel Young in same document) of the Township of Barton, a U.E. Loyalist.
- 18) Land petition of Rachael Young of the Township of Barton, daughter of Abraham Young of Haldimand in the District of Gore a U.E. Loyalist. In this document, there is a certificate signed by Daniel Young Captain of the

Late 5<sup>th</sup> L.M. attesting to the War service of Rachael's husband Henry Young [Senior, the son of the said Daniel Young].

In the above muster lists we also find, under the 5<sup>th</sup> Lincoln Militia, Sgt. Henry Young (above), George Young, and William Teriberry (William Terryberry) all of whom are ancestors of mine. Again, at a later date I might apply for certificates based on descent from these ancestors – although it is all basically the same documentation needed.
